

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
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

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# INSPIRING INTERIORS

**Hester Grainger** chatted to Melanie Tomlinson, director at Melanie Tomlinson design. Melanie shares moving from Australia to England and being award-nominated

## Where did it all begin – talk us through your story

Starting my design career in 1997, I focused my studies on architectural drafting and technology before refining my academia with interior design at the International School of Colour and Design Sydney.

I spent my formative years working for names like Reel Grobman in Silicon Valley, California, Response Design Group, Paul Kelly & Paynter Dixon in Australia. Assisting internationally renowned designer Thomas Hamel for one year was a real highlight for me. Reflecting on this time, this was where I developed my desire to create warm, sophisticated spaces that my clients are delighted to come home to every day. It was also the launch pad for Design Bubble, a Sydney based

practice I dearly loved building for the next eight years.

#### When did you launch your business?

Melanie Tomlinson Design was formed in 2017 following a move to the UK from Sydney, Australia with my young family. Having always loved the UK and been lucky enough to have spent time here previously, it had always appealed as an opportunity for a new adventure. That and the exposure you get here compared to any other country to the variety of design and architecture. You can see it all from beautiful heritage buildings to stunning modern design – often in the same town!

Wrapping up my previous design studio in Sydney, located close to where we were living in the city, and making a move seemed



the perfect time to launch independently as Melanie Tomlinson Design and I haven't looked back.

## Where does your passion for interiors come from?

From an early age, while at high school, I






always moved furniture around, restyling rooms and photographing them to capture the "before" and "after".


While attending a ten-year school reunion a few years ago, my school friends said it was inevitable and "they knew I would become an interior designer".

Still to this day, I can vividly remember the interior layouts, colours, and styles of friends and family homes. It is like I captured an image in my mind and can recall right down to wall colours and accessories.

#### What's been your favourite project to date?

Turramurra House was originally the owner's family home; she grew up there with her sisters and had strong connections and memories. The family didn't want to part with the house as the location and aspect were perfect; however, it needed to become "their" home, resulting in a complete renovation. They had a strong love for designers Thomas Hamel and Victoria Hagan. Both originally American designers, it was agreed that their influence would be carried throughout the





home to give it a "new traditional" feel – one that suited their growing family and provided a relaxed yet formal setting.

There was no rush with this project; it would be a "forever home" and true labour of love, slowly developing each unique space. The family were involved every step of the way, even visiting sandstone quarries to choose stone for the fireplace's mantle. The result is a home that feels like a home, with places found for all their loved objects and artworks collected over the years.

I was extremely excited when the "garden kitchen" was nominated for best kitchen in the Belle Coco Republic Interior Design Awards 2015, inspired by French Farmhouses; our clients were quite organic, growing their fruit and vegetables, it was the perfect "second kitchen" for cleaning and preparing the produce.

## What are you working on at the moment?

We are lucky enough to be working on a full-scale renovation of a penthouse in an art deco building in Berkshire, having been appointed as sole interior architectural designers alongside exterior landscaping design of the stunning wrap-around terrace.

Alongside other residential projects, we are also undertaking a commercial project, which I enjoyed during my time in Australia. Creating immersive interiors in innovative spaces brings a unique perspective to design as you must consider customer experience alongside form and function.

## What are your top tips when designing rooms in your house?

It must start with spatial planning – how you use and live in the current space and what you are looking to achieve that is different. Seek out plenty of natural light, which rooms

benefit the most and at what times of the day. Form and function must be considered with furniture layout to maximise space. And finally, the integration of unique pieces you already own into a design scheme, so the personality is reflected in those who live there.

#### What inspires you?

Variation in architecture and design is so inspiring, and I believe it has afforded me the luxury of never really having a "signature" style, something that can happen in the design world. I adore much of the American design influence alongside the Australian coastal Hamptons vibe. I have also been lucky enough to travel in Europe and take much influence from European design.

## What is the favourite room in your house and why?

As a business owner and mum of two very sporty and energetic boys it must be the laundry room! Functionality in a home should never be overlooked. The laundry room has to be the ultimate multi-purpose room in a home! I had real fun designing it as they can often be the smallest rooms that demand the most.

Being clever with space and storage meant I got to plan well and source great products for practical modern living solutions.

Living well to Jo means cocooning your senses with natural aromas, texture, and aesthetics, creating a soulful environment of wellness and comfort, for a happier home. Following her holistic home philosophy, Jo regularly practises meditation, Reiki, and sound therapy, to help improve daily health and wellbeing. Having been born in Chalfont St Giles, Jo is a huge fan of Cliveden and loves visiting Newbury when she can, to browse the antiques fairs.

#### Why does scent matter?

Having written many books and articles about wellbeing throughout my career, I know that when we are increasingly stressed and stretched in our daily lives, where better to feel more relaxed, and chilled, or joyful and reinvigorated, than at home. As a working mother, pretty much consumed with guilt whenever I wasn't there, I made a ritual of wearing natural scents in the home to comfort my children when they were younger.

From tiny, I would bathe them in lavender and chamomile oil; spritz the rooms with geranium, orange and frankincense; dab cut knees with lavender (the dog too): to me, nature's botanicals are like first aid therapy in a bottle. 
in a cocoon of contentment, happiness, and peace, where we can reconnect with our emotions.

#### What made you decide to create your own home aroma collection?






## How can we get the most from your candles?

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Could leftover coffee, tea and other drinks feed your plants? Experts sort fact from fiction on less traditional plant food. By **Hannah Stephenson** 

f you're prone to drinking half a cup of coffee and pouring the rest down the sink, the excess could give a boost to your houseplants in winter and beyond.

Experts at WeThrift (wethrift

Experts at WeThrift (wethrift. com) say coffee can be a great fertiliser for your plants because it contains some of the essential nutrients they plants need, such as nitrogen, potassium, calcium and magnesium.

RHS chief horticultural adviser Guy Barter agrees: "Undrunk beverages can be beneficial. Lots of people empty the teapot contents once they are cool onto their houseplants."

So, which leftover liquids will really make a difference? Here, experts unravel the fact from the fiction...

#### **COFFEE**

"We did some research and found tea and coffee are quite good for plants. They contain a modicum of nitrogen - but if you put milk in your drink it can get a bit smelly and rotten in the soil, although it's alright for outside," says Barter.

If you take sugar in your coffee, that may reduce the beneficial effects to your plants because it can lock up nitrogen, he warns. In that case, add ordinary fertiliser if plants go a bit yellow. Try to avoid using coffee which has had milk or cream added if you're going to deposit your dregs on houseplants.

Putting coffee grounds into your compost heap is an organic way to give plants a huge boost, according to experts at WeThrift, who add that coffee grounds can also be used for most houseplants.

But they warn against over-feeding plants with coffee, only giving them a boost about once a week. Acid-loving plants such as azaleas, hydrangeas and bromeliads prefer coffee to other plants like roses, which can end up with a burnt stem if they are overfed.

#### TEA

"Tea is slightly acid, although if you have really alkaline water, that might reduce the acidity. People have historically used it on their indoor azaleas and gardenias and it's thought to be good for houseplants," says



Barter, although again try to avoid using milky tea. However, a Which? study in 2010 found it's unlikely that much of the nitrogen in tea is actually available to plants and that tea also contains aluminium, fluorine and manganese, which are harmless to people but high concentrations in very strong or stewed tea could stunt plant growth. It concluded that tea leaves are best put on the compost heap, rather than around your plants.

#### BEER

While most people tend to use beer to attract slugs into beer traps in the garden, some have taken to pouring it on their plants. The idea is that the acid in beer will kill pests, and the sugar and yeast will add beneficial soil microbes, assisting growth.

However, there doesn't seem to be much substance to claims that it boosts the life of houseplants. "I don't think it contains much nitrogen or plant food, so I wouldn't have thought it's a good substitute for regular houseplant fertiliser," says Barter.

#### CARBONATED DRINKS

Fizzy drinks tend to contain sugar, which prevents plants from absorbing nutrients, so don't go pouring lemonade or cola on your houseplants.

"In the old days when lemonade was very sugary, it was excellent for putting cut flowers in because it's acid, which stops the bacteria, and had sugar in it which would feed the stems. I'm not sure modern lemonade would do that," adds Barter. Research shows that carbonated mineral water may be

better, as it commonly contains many of the macronutrients hat are essential for healthy plant growth.

According to a 2002 study conducted at Colorado University Boulder, carbonated water makes plants grow faster and makes green plants grow greener.

Carbonated water which has gone flat can also be used on houseplants, but make sure you don't pour it on your plants straight from the fridge, as this may send them into shock.

#### WASHING UP LIQUID

"Using old washing up water to water your plants outside the back door shouldn't do any harm. There will be a certain amount of phosphorus in it, but it might be too grubby for indoor plants," Barter advises.

#### AT THE END OF THE DAY...

"I can't think of anything that's a really good substitute for proper fertiliser," says Barter.

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

ccording to The Sleep

no 'normal' length of time, it is whatever is
natural for you. As a mum of two, I often find
it difficult to get a good night's sleep. So I
decided to test the latest products and see if
any of them really can help me sleep better.

#### Relax and unwind

Giving us a few minutes each night to connect, talk and create a safe space for feelings. It worked so well and stopped him from waking in the night that I just had to make a more concentrated version for me!"

The Sleep Journal is the brainchild of Anne Marie Boyhan, a mum turned functional diagnostic nutritionist and health coach, who wrote it to find a solution to her sleep struggles, as she couldn't find everything sleep-related in one place.

Boyhan says: "I believe that great days are built on the night before."





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
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## FAVOURED FLAVOURS

Food writer Ed Smith is all about warming, comforting meals. He is also a pro at making delicious dinners from whatever is in his fridge

d Smith's food ethos is all about working out what your body craves and sorting dinner out from there.

It is a reminder to listen to our bodies a bit more (something so few of us actually do), but it doesn't mean things are different every day.

Smith returns to certain meals and ingredients time and time again – be it a bowl of brothy beans, or his beloved instant dashi powder.

This is (almost) everything you need to know about Smith's approach to food...

#### Your death row meal is...

It depends on the craving, but I think I'd probably be seeking solace in some kind of brothy beans. Pork belly, brothy beans, olives – comforting, but there's a little bit of life in there as well. And then right now, I'm thinking tiramisu, to dive into.

#### The one dish you can't get right in the kitchen...

I could improve my sushi rolling.

#### Your favourite store cupboard

I am in love with instant dashi powder, it's excellent. It's such a layered and flavoursome and moreish and umami-ful base for loads of things. In the book – *Crave: Recipes Arranged By Flavour, To Suit Your Mood And Appetite* – it's used in the chicken and rice dish. What makes miso soup taste good is having a good dashi, for example. That's a great savoury fix to have your instant dashi, a mug of water and a spoonful of miso – suddenly you're soothed and everything is right again.

#### You like your eggs...

I favour six and a half minutes, boiled, peeled and cut in half. That's great in a ramen, or on toast with some chilli oil.

#### The kitchen utensil you can't live without is...

A silicon spatula.

#### Your favourite late-night snack is...

Expensive sourdough toast with lots of butter; mature cheddar and kimchi, or some other chillied condiment.

#### The ultimate childhood dinner you always remember is...

You can't go wrong with a good old spag bol.



Your takeout of choice tends to be... Vietnamese.

#### What did you eat last night?


Last night we had meatballs made out of veal, smoky bacon, orange zest and sage, with some fregula [a type of Sardinian pasta] and a tomato sauce. It was lovely because it was cold, and we'd been outside all day with my son, who was pretty annoyed and upset at the weather – as was I. That was a rich, powerful and very comforting meal.

#### Your signature dish is...

I don't have a signature dish, I like to cook everything all the time. Actually, my signature is a fridge forage – making something good from whatever's in the fridge.

#### RECIPE

## Rasta pumpkin pasta

Serves: 6-8

#### **INGREDIENTS**

500g pumpkin or butternut squash, peeled, deseeded and diced

1 whole garlic bulb

1 Scotch bonnet or chilli pepper, deseeded and chopped

Olive oil, for cooking

200g coconut yoghurt

Leaves of 2 rosemary sprigs

6 fresh thyme sprigs or 1tsp dried thyme

1 vegan stock cube

1 x 400ml can coconut milk

1tbsp golden syrup

500g dried penne pasta

1 onion, sliced

1 red bell pepper, deseeded and sliced

1 green bell pepper, deseeded and sliced

1 yellow bell pepper, deseeded and sliced 1tbsp jerk paste

Salt and freshly ground black pepper Handful of parsley, chopped, to serve

#### **METHOD**

- Preheat the oven to 170°C Fan/190°C/Gas 5. Place a sheet of baking parchment on a baking tray. Add the diced pumpkin or squash, garlic bulb and Scotch bonnet or chilli, then sprinkle two tablespoons of olive oil and one teaspoon each of salt and black pepper on it and mix together. Roast in the oven for 25 minutes until cooked through and starting to caramelise.
- Leave to cool for five minutes, then dash into a blender, squeezing the soft garlic cloves out of their papery skins. Add the yoghurt, rosemary and thyme and crumble in the stock cube. Add half the coconut milk, the syrup, salt to taste and a splash of water. Blend together until smooth.
- Bring a large saucepan of salted water to the boil. Add the pasta and cook according to the packet instructions, then drain.
- Meanwhile, in a large saucepan, heat two tablespoons of olive oil until hot. Add the onion and bell peppers and sauté for five minutes until soft, then add in the blended pumpkin sauce, remaining coconut milk and jerk paste. Stir, then simmer, uncovered, for five minutes until thickened.
- Add the drained pasta to the sauce and combine well to coat. Add a sprinkling of parsley and enjoy.

# Trini split pea dhal with spinach and okra

Serves: 4

#### **INGREDIENTS**

350g dried split peas

1.7L water

1 medium onion, very finely chopped

1 scotch bonnet pepper, deseeded and very finely chopped

2tbsp ground turmeric

1tsp ground cumin

1tsp ground pimento (allspice)

1tbsp mango chutney, plus extra to serve

Handful of spinach

3tbsp vegetable oil

4 garlic cloves, chopped

1tbsp cumin seeds

2 bay leaves

8 okra, sliced lengthways

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

#### **METHOD**

- Firstly, wash and drain the split peas two or three times, until the water runs clear. Add them to a large pot with the water and bring to the boil. Now season with the onion, scotch bonnet, turmeric, ground cumin, pimento, mango chutney and salt and black pepper to taste. Simmer for 40 minutes until the peas are tender.
- Use a stick blender to blend until mushy but not completely smooth. Add a little more salt and black pepper to taste, stir in the spinach to wilt, take off the heat and allow to rest the liquid will soak into the peas, thickening it. Add a little more hot water if it needs loosening.
- In a frying pan, heat the oil and add the garlic, cumin seeds and bay leaves. Fry for three to four minutes until sizzling and fragrant, being careful not to burn them, then dash them into the curry.
- In the same frying pan, pan-fry the sliced okra and serve alongside the curry, with rice and flatbreads. Serve extra mango chutney and hot pepper sauce on the side.



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



## VIRAL CONCERNS

Why do some parents catch Covid from their children but others don't? GPs explain some of the possible reasons for transmission within households. By **Katie Wright**

t is easy to think that if your child catches Covid, surely the whole household is likely to come down with it too. So, why is it that some parents catch Covid from their kids, while others somehow manage to stay virus-free?

After an initial steep fall, Omicron cases appear to have plateaued in the UK right now, levelling out at an average of around 90k a day. Particularly high levels of Covid are being detected in children, with cases rising amongst 10 to 19-year-olds, which is likely due to pupils returning to school after the Christmas holidays too.

Yet when it comes to parents, are some just luckier than others? There is no guarantee that just because a child tests positive, their parents are going to catch Covid too – even if you're not really isolating from one another at home.

"I've got lots of families where some mothers or fathers haven't got it – and there are lots of reasons for that," says Dr Paul Ettlinger, founder of London General Practice (thelondongeneralpractice.com).

#### Viral load and immunity

Ettlinger believes there are two main factors that determine whether Covid will be passed from a child to a parent. "One of the reasons is the actual viral load that the child has. If they don't have a high viral load, they may not be transmissible," Ettlinger explains. "The other reason is the immunity of the mother or the father."

Immunity can come from antibodies or T cells, meaning "the baseline immunity in the body. It's something that you would have got from having either the vaccination, or you might have had the actual virus without knowing it."

After all, some parents may have previously had asymptomatic Covid, giving them a greater level of protection. In addition, new research suggests another possible reason for increased immunity.

Dr Belinda Griffiths from The Fleet Street Clinic (fleetstreetclinic.com) explains: "There is no conclusive proof as yet, but the theory of why some people will catch Covid from close contacts and other people in the same close contact will not, is thought to be due to possible previous exposure to a coronavirus, such as the common cold, giving some form of immunity or protection."

That does not mean that if you have had a cold you are immune to Covid, but the exposure may in some cases have helped: "It is thought that the pre-existing T cells from a previous coronavirus quickly deal with the threat of a new infection by triggering an immune response, so the individual does not have symptoms or signs of infection. But the tests are not yet fully conclusive and we need more data."

Can you reduce the risk of transmission at home? While adults sharing the same house or flat may be able to isolate to some extent, it's a lot harder when children are involved.

"If you want to be strict, then yes, you should do the strict isolation, wear a mask, etc," says Dr Ettlinger. "But of course, you've got to take into account that [the parents] have probably been looking after their child anyway when they were actually infectious."

And if your children are young, feeling poorly, and you do not have enough rooms to keep everyone separate anyway, then of course it is understandable that isolating within the home is not always realistic.

The most important thing you can do, says Ettlinger is: "Definitely to get vaccinated. The risks of catching Covid far outweigh the risks of vaccination - that is very, very important."


Last year, despite Covid restrictions, the Reading charity delivered 345 appointments and 67% of the women who received support went on to get the job.

"Our goal is to ensure that each client leaves Smart Works feeling confident in her own abilities and equipped with the best possible chance of job success."

# THE SUPPORT TEAM

Going behind the scenes with the dedicated teams who care for racehorses ahead of Cheltenham Festival



nown as the Olympics of horseracing, it is no surprise that it "takes a village" to get the equine athletes to the start line during Cheltenham Festival. From 15-18 March, more than 150 horses will perform on one of horseracing's greatest stages.

The thrill of horseracing has long captured our nation, in fact it's our second biggest spectator sport. Cheltenham Festival itself hosts some of racing's most talented animals and one of Jump racing's most famed races, the Cheltenham Gold Cup that dates back to 1924. It is made clear by the racegoer's legendary "Cheltenham roar" when a horse crosses the winning line, what an exhilarating and heart-warming sport horseracing is.

But the high-octane thrill of the raceday is a far cry from the calmer day-to-day life of these spectacular athletes. Whether it's a morning run on the gallops, taking a restorative swim in a state-of-the-art equine swimming pool or a physiotherapy session to ease away any

aching muscles, there's a huge team involved in keeping a racehorse fit and healthy.

Like all athletes, racehorses have tailored training programmes to suit their individual needs and it takes an extraordinary partnership between a racehorse and those that support it to understand what works best.

Typically, a racehorse will have a team of at least six core people involved in the 365 days of care and raceday preparation. The core team is made up of a trainer, yard staff, work rider, farrier, vet and physio not to mention the wider dedicated team members such as the secretary, jockey, nutritionist, chiropractor, traveling team and equine dentist.

### THE TEAM

Trainer – In charge of the running of the yard. It is their job to observe and know each horse individually. needs. They will plan a horse's season and training accordingly.

Work rider – Rides the horse during training and is responsible for getting to know each horse to be able to give performance feedback to the trainer.

Vet - Regularly monitors each horse's health and wellbeing. Tends to any horse with injury







**Secretary** - Responsible for entering horse in races and supporting logistics with all staff in the yard.

Traveling team - Responsible for the care of horses on a raceday. The travelling team will take charge of logistics and the horses wellbeing.

Equine dentist – Ensures that the horse is healthy and comfortable during its work.

Jockey – Rides the horse in the race and will school the horse over fences during training

Farrier – Responsible for looking after horse's feet and shoeing the horse during training and pre-race (usually every four to six weeks).

Physio – Regularly visits racing yards to give horses pre and post-race care.

Nutritionist - Ensures that each horse has appropriate food to suit its temperament and amount of work during training.

Yard staff – Responsible for feeding and caring for the horse. This includes mucking out, washing horse and grooming.

**Chiropractor** – Visits yards to tend to horses during their off-season.

Yard staff spend the most time with the horse and have a vital role to play in a racehorse's day-to-day care that contributes to their performance on a raceday. Each

horse will be tended to by a member of yard staff who will feed them, wash them down after exercise, ensure the horse is the right temperature and often travel with the horse when racing for familiarity. It is also their duty to make sure the space in and around the yard is well-kept to create a calm and relaxing atmosphere each day.

Local trainers including Nicky Henderson, Warren Greatrex and Jamie Snowden will have racehorses competing during prestigious sporting event.

# Business Lasting Powers of Attorney

### What are they?

Most people are aware of Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPAs). These are legal documents which allow an individual or individuals referred to as your attorneys to manage your affairs. You can appoint your attorneys to either manage your 'Property and Financial' or 'Health and Welfare' affairs.

A Business LPA is a useful document which allows a business owner to appoint an attorney or attorneys to make decisions in the best interests of the organisation should the owner become mentally incapacitated, is abroad on holiday or business or has had an accident and does not have the capabilities to make a decision.

Business Lasting Powers of Attorney can be useful for business either as Sole Traders, Limited Liability Partnerships, Traditional Partnerships and Directors.

## What do they do?

The Business LPA would allow the appointed individuals or individuals to make decisions such as authorising the payment of invoices, signing company cheques, instructing employees to perform key tasks, employing new members of staff and dealing with the daily business activities.

### Who should I appoint?

It is advisable that the attorney is familiar with the business and is someone who can be entrusted with the affairs of the business. The attorney should be someone who is confident, trustworthy, competent, reliable and can undertake the tasks to manage the business in the absence of the owner.

In the best interests of the business it may be pertinent to appoint two attorneys- one to deal with the dealings / everyday activities of the business (e.g. business accountant or employee) and the other attorney who deals with the personal financial issues (e.g. a member of the family).

# The Implications of not preparing a business Lasting Power of Attorney

If there is no business lasting powers of attorney in place, this could prove to be extremely detrimental to the business. If this is the case and there is an absence of a business lasting power of attorney, an application would need to made and submitted to the Court of Protection which is time consuming and expensive. During this period, the business may suffer with no one in person to manage the daily affairs.

# BEV IS A BEAUTY

**lan Lamming** has his interest sparked by a new name in the automotive industry, the Scandinavian Polestar2, which exceeds all expectations







ur collective heads are all over the place at the moment so why not launch a new brand? Not only do we have myriad marques, model types and specifications to consider but the added complication of whether we choose the familiar diesels and petrols or be brave and sensible and have a long hard look at electrics.

There has been a massive shift towards clean battery-powered electric vehicles (now called BEVs) in recent times helped by the soaring price of crude oil, more affordable car prices and longer ranges.

Scandinavia has always been ahead of the ecology game, so it's no surprise that the new name should come from Sweden and have the support of Volvo.

Welcome Polestar2, a fully electric volume model with more than a hint of Volvo about it. It is a clean cut, high quality, five-door fastback and a very appealing alternative to mainstream brands.

The Polestar 2 model range now includes three variants - the long range dual motors with 300 kW, 408hp/660Nm, the long range single motor with 170kW, 231 hp/330Nm and the standard range single motor offering 165kW, 224 hp/330Nm. There are also three option packages - Pilot, Plus and Performance - to keep the choices simple.

Which did I have? Haven't a clue as I forgot to ask. If I had to guess I'd say the single motor variant and if that's correct it was more than enough car for me.

With BEVs, range is everything if you are to avoid the anxiety associated with the switch from fossil fuels to electric. Even the entry level model has more than enough performance, power that is so instant and controllable that it makes all internal combustion engines feel sluggish and unrefined. That said, in electrics your speed will seldom exceed 60mph on a long journey as after that point on the speedo it chomps through the battery reserve at an alarming rate.

Drive local and you are care-free, enjoying the blistering performance this BEV offers. If you have to travel 75 miles in one direction then you need to pace yourself to ensure you have enough charge to get back. You always do, generally with 30 per cent left in the cells, it's just a confidence thing but one that grows quickly the more journeys you make.

So, Polestar2 looks smart, modern, classy and from the rear is striking thanks to lights that stretch the full width of the car. It is also fabulous to drive with an attractive price tag.



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
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
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
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
